Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner was not caught at the spot but falsely implicated.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the State has submitted that the petitioner has been named in the FIR and petitioner is member of a gang who are into drug paddling(Narcotic). Learned counsel has further submitted that the petitioner is also involved in another case i.e. FIR No.161, dated 29.09.2017, under Sections 21/25/29 of NDPS Act, 1985 and Sections 307/332/353/186 IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Sadar Patti, District Tarn Taran, although, released on bail in the aforesaid case.

The offence alleged against the petitioner is heinous. Hence, no ground to grant concession of regular bail to the petitioner is made out.

The present petition is dismissed.
