Learned counsel for the petitioner firstly points to the fact that the petitioner had been nominated as an accused on the statement of a co-accused and further, that though the confessional statement of the petitioner alleged to have been taken from him (as per the police) on 2.4.2019 (copy Annexure P-4), shows that the petitioner confessed that the stolen car was kept concealed under the flats at Hollywood Height Flats, Chandigarh Road, Kurali, Mohali, even learned State counsel on inspection of the police file would not be able to deny that the recovery memo of the said vehicle shows that it was recovered from the address of the petitioner, i.e. House No. 6-E, New Pratap Nagar, Gurudwara Shri Chand, Amritsar.

Though learned State counsel submits that there are 14 other FIRs shown to have been registered against the petitioner under various offences, however, keeping in view the aforesaid discrepancy, at this stage, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case for or against the

petitioner, I consider it appropriate to release the petitioner on bail pending trial. Consequently, he would be enlarged on bail, upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
