1. Prayer in the writ petition is for the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant approval to the petitioner-institute for additional course i.e. Diploma in Pharmacy (2 years) as also to direct respondent No.2 to consider the petitioner-institute during admission counseling for D. Pharmacy course and to allot students to the petitioner-institute after counseling.

2. Learned counsel for respondent No.1 has produced copy of notification dated 10.06.2019 issued by the All India Council for Technical Education to the Financial Commissioner and Principal Secretary (Technical) Govt. of Haryana, Chandigarh, granting extension of approval for the academic year 2019-20 to the petitioner-institute to conduct Pharmacy Course with intake indicated therein for

the academic year 2019-20 while learned counsel for respondent No.2 has produced a copy of communication issued by respondent No.2 dated 19.06.2019, addressed to the Principal of the petitioner-institute granting provisional affiliation for the academic session 2019-20 to conduct diploma course of two years in Pharmacy with intake of 60 students for the academic year 2019-20. Aforementioned communications are taken on record and copy handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner. Learned counsel for the respondents states that in view of the aforementioned communications, the writ petition has become infructuous and may be disposed of as such.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in the light of the communications as referred to above, he does not press the writ petition and the same may be disposed of as having infructuous.

4. In view of the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the writ petition is disposed of as having become infructuous.
