After notice of motion had been issued on 28.08.2019, also admitting the petitioner to interim bail, on 30.09.2019 the following order had been passed:-

“Though Mr. Rajat Bansal, learned AAG, Punjab, was present on the last date of hearing, with ASI Ajay Kumar also having come to assist him, Mr. Gill submits that the brief of the case has not been sent to him, possibly because it has not been prepared at all.

A copy of the petition has been handed over to the learned State counsel, who also submits that none has come to assist him in the matter, with learned counsel for the petitioner submitting that in fact even a copy of the FIR itself has not been made available to the petitioner, resulting in it not having been annexed with the petition.

Though that is difficult to believe in view of

the fact that prior to the present petition, a similar one had been filed before the learned Sessions Judge, Rupnagar, which was dismissed on May 20, 2019, however, a copy of the FIR be placed on record by the learned State counsel, before the next date of hearing.

Adjourned to 01.11.2019.

Interim order to continue.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from the police official who is present in Court to assist him, submits that the petitioner has joined investigation pursuant to the order dated 28.08.2019 and presently his custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of above, the interim order dated 28.08.2019 passed by this Court is made absolute, on the same terms and conditions.

The petition is disposed of accordingly.
