Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr. P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail to petitioner, in FIR No.88 dated 19.04.2019, under Sections 307, 324, 323, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short 'IPC') (Section 326 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station City Kapurthala, District Kapurthala.

On 09.09.2019, this Court has passed the following order:-

“Contends that the matter has been compromised between the parties.

Adjourned to 07.11.2019.

Interim order dated 29.05.2019 passed by this Court is modified to the extent that, in the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to join investigation before the Investigating Officer. In the event of his arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit him to interim bail, till the next date of hearing, on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his

satisfaction. The petitioner is also directed to abide by all the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Paramjit Singh, has stated that in terms of order dated 09.09.2019, the petitioner has joined investigation and his custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of the above, order dated 09.09.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.

Petition stands disposed off, accordingly.

However, it is made clear that the petitioner shall fully co-operate with the Investigating Officer as and when called for further investigation.

The above observations may not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
