Present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.11 dated 18.01.2018, under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Baghapurana, District Moga.

This Court, while issuing notice of motion on 14.02.2018, passed the following order:-

“ *Notice of motion.*

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Luvinder Sofat, Assistant Advocate General, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. Let a copy of the paper-book be supplied to him during the course of the day.

List on 31.08.2018.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest of the petitioner by the Arresting/Investigating Officer, she shall be released on interim bail subject to the following conditions:-

- 1. That she shall make herself available for interrogation by a Police Officer as and when required;
- 2. That she shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any Police Officer and;
- 3. That she shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court. ”

Today, learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has joined the investigation in terms of aforesaid order and her custodial interrogation is no longer required.

The aforesaid factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State Counsel, on instructions from ASI Buta Singh.

In view of above, interim order dated 14.02.2018 is made absolute subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. and the present petition stands disposed off.

It is made clear that the petitioner shall fully co-operate with the Investigating Officer as and when called for further investigation.

The observations may not be considered as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
