The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of the order dated 6.8.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No. 25739 of 2017. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“3. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 3 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in her representation dated 2.6.2017 (P-7) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order as per rules and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab from time to time, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, she shall be at liberty to approach this Court.”

Reply dated 6.9.2019 by way of affidavit of Sh. Vikas Hira, Sub Divisional Magistrate Amritsar-I filed in Court is taken on record. Copy thereof handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner. Along with the reply, order dated 15.5.2019 has been annexed, whereby the representation of the petitioner has been decided.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in view of the reply filed, no cause of action survives for pursuing the present contempt petition, however, he seeks liberty to avail remedies available in accordance with law against the order dated 15.5.2019.

Disposed of as infructuous with liberty as prayed for.
