Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that vide order dated 25.04.2011, the petitioner has been treated to be retired from service w.e.f. 30.04.2002 but till today, no benefit of the service which the petitioner had rendered with respondents, has been extended to him after retiring him w.e.f. 30.04.2002.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that once the petitioner has rendered service and has been retired, he is entitled for all the pensionary benefits.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that for the relief which has been claimed in the present writ petition, the petitioner has submitted a representation dated 18.02.2019 (Annexure P-8) to the respondents and thereafter, reminder of the representation on 19.03.2019 (Annexure P-9) and the petitioner will be satisfied, at this stage, in case a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to decide the same by passing an appropriate speaking order.

Without commenting upon the merits of the case or about the entitlement of the petitioner for the relief which has been claimed by him in the representations dated 18.02.2019 (Annexure P-8) and dated 19.03.2019 (Annexure P-9), the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to decide the representations dated 18.02.2019 (Annexure P-8) and dated 19.03.2019 (Annexure P-9) within a period of three months from the receipt of certified copy of this order.
