Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.36 dated 06.04.2019 under Sections 22/29/61/85 of NDPS Act and Section 27-A of Drugs and Cosmetics Act, registered at Police Station Chhajli, District Sangrur.

As per allegations in the FIR, the Investigating Officer was present at Bus Stand Mahila Chowk in connection with checking of suspicious persons and a secret information was received that Mohd. Sohail had gone to Delhi to receive narcotic medicines on 05.04.2019 and he is coming back from Delhi with huge quantity of narcotics. It is further stated that petitioner Jagjit Singh has given money to Mohd. Sohail and he is also a partner in this illegal business. Accordingly, the Investigating Officer sent an information to the police station to register a case against the petitioner and co-accused Mohd.

Sohail. Later on, aforesaid co-accused was apprehended and recovery of 13500 tablets of Tramadol Hydrochloride 100 mg Clovidol-100 SR was effected from him.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that the petitioner was not arrested at the spot and no recovery was effected from him.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Chhattar Singh, submits that even on an earlier occasion, the petitioner was found involved in FIR No.56 dated 07.09.2018 under Sections 22/61/85 of NDPS Act, Police Station City-I, Sangrur and apart from this FIR, he is also involved in two other FIRs i.e. FIR No.102 dated 07.04.2018 under Sections 341, 323, 324, 34, 506 IPC, Police Station City Sangrur and FIR No.11 dated 22.02.2013 under Sections 341/323 IPC, Police Station Sadar Sunam.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, considering the serious allegations and heavy recovery effected from the co-accused, who has suffered a disclosure statement regarding involvement of the petitioner and in view of the fact that the FIR was registered on the basis of a secret information, in which the petitioner was named to be a person, who has given money to co-accused Mohd. Sohail and also considering the fact that the petitioner is involved in one another case under NDPS Act, I find no ground to grant anticipatory bail to him.

Petition is dismissed.
