This criminal revision petition has been filed by the petitioner for setting aside the impugned orders dated 15.01.2016 and 29.01.2016 passed by the Ld. Trial Court.

Vide order dated 31.03.2017 passed by this Court, the petitioner was granted interim bail.

Status report by way of affidavit dated 09.12.2019 of Senior Superintendent of Police, District Tarn Taran on behalf of respondent-State has been filed today in the Court, which is taken on record and it reveals that after grant of interim bail, one FIR under NDPS Act and one FIR under Section 174-A IPC have been registered against the petitioner.

Learned State counsel states that since the bail granted to an accused is always conditional, in case of breach thereof, the accused is not entitled to the concession of bail.

If a fresh FIR has been registered against the petitioner during the period he was on bail, this factor can not be taken into consideration at this stage and can only be considered at the time of consideration of the bail application of the petitioner in the subsequent FIR.

In view of the above, without commenting anything on the merits, lest it should prejudice the case of either side, the order dated 31.03.2017 passed by this Court is made absolute qua petitioner-Rajbir Singh alias Raju.
