Although, petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure is not maintainable once the petitioner had submitted to the jurisdiction of the Court and was granted regular bail, however, in the interest of justice, this petition is treated as one under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contend that the petitioner could not appear before the trial Court on 02.04.2019 due to medical emergency and therefore, the learned Court issued non-bailable warrants.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner would surrender before the trial Court within 10 days and seek bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds.

Keeping in view the aforesaid undertaking that if the petitioner surrenders within the aforesaid time and apply for regular bail, he be released on regular bail subject to furnishing of requisite personal bonds and surety to

the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate, Tarn Taran.

Keeping in view the assertions made, this petition is disposed
