FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

Report dated 14.10.2019 of the Mediator from Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court has been received accompanied by the settlement/agreement in original whereby the parties on both sides i.e. complainant wife Anita as well as the accused petitioners namely Vijay Kumar, Mahabir Singh, Kela Devi and Phool Singh have settled their dispute amicably.

Learned counsel for the complainant/respondent No.2 as well as learned counsel for the accused/petitioners have made statement that as per instructions received, the parties had given final effect to their agreement settlement/compromise and that nothing is due towards

anyone on account of this settlement and that the final effect be given to this petition.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Mediator and the fact that the dispute between the parties being a pure matrimonial and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.0087 dated 16.06.2017 under Sections 323, 498-A, 506 IPC pertaining to Police Station Ding, District Sirsa and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands disposed off in those terms.
