As per averments on record, petitioner is engaged in the business of transport and holds a valid State Carriage Permit issued by the Regional Transport Authority, Patiala at Annexure P-1. It is the categorical contention made by counsel that the State Carriage Permit at Annexure P-1 even though, expired on 21.6.2019 but the same has been renewed for a period of five years i.e. up to the year 2024.

The grievance raised in the instant petition is that illegal operation of three wheelers/auto rickshaws from within the bus stand, Dera Bassi, District S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali continues unabated.

Counsel contends that there is a complete violation of various provisions of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988 as also Rules 194/195 of the Punjab Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Luvinder Sofat, learned A.A.G., Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents no.1 to 6. A complete copy of the writ paper book already stands furnished.

Statement of learned State counsel is recorded to the effect that the matter would be looked into at the hands of the Secretary, Regional

Transport Authority, S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali and if the assertions made in the petition are found to be correct, necessary remedial steps and as warranted towards compliance of the provisions of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988 and the Punjab Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989 would be put in place.

In the light of such statement recorded of learned State counsel, no further directions are required to be passed.

Writ petition is accordingly disposed of.
