This petition has been filed by Lachhman Singh Chhabra under Section 482 Cr.P.C for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.2 to 5 to decide the representation dated 01.05.2019 (Annexure P-2) and for taking action against private respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that son of the petitioner, namely, Amandeep Singh Chhabra died on 03.09.2018 at Corporate Hospital, Amritsar after taking coffee at his residence with Sandeep Kaur @ Gopi. According to him, the said coffee was prepared by said lady and after consuming the same, he fell ill. According to him, inquest proceedings were also carried and the DDR No.21 dated 24.09.2018 was also registered by the Police. He suspected that the lady Sandeep Kaur @ Gopi who in conspiracy with Bitta, gave poisonous substance to his son.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and perusing the representation dated 01.05.2019 (Annexure P-2), this Court finds that it is a

case of the petitioner that the victim had illicit relations with Sandeep Kaur @ Gopi with whom he was working as a driver. As per the representation, the son of the petitioner was having two mobile phones which were taken into possession by said Sandeep Kuar when he was shifted to hospital and the same were not returned. The phones contained the photographs of illicit relations of Sandeep Kuar and his son.

Learned counsel for the petitioner was asked to produce the inquest report and the statement recorded at that stage, however, he is unable to produce any of the relevant material.

Considering the above and the fact that the representation was given after a long delay of one year, this Court does not find any reason to invoke inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C.

Petition is dismissed.
