Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that in terms of the order passed in SLP (C) No. 14718 of 2010, decided on 30.01.2018, the late husband of the petitioner had become entitled for the grant of pension. Counsel argues that after the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court, petitioner has also sent a legal notice dated 10.01.2019 (Annexure P-4) for the grant of pension to her late husband, namely, Kuldeep Singh and also family pension after his death, as Sh. Kuldeep Singh, unfortunately, died on 16.02.1999.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that petitioner will be satisfied, at this stage, in case a time bound direction is issued to the respondents to decide the legal notice by passing a speaking order.

Without going into the merits of the case or expressing any opinion to the entitlement of the petitioner in respect of the relief claimed in the present writ petition or in the legal notice, the present writ petition is

disposed of with a direction to the respondents to pass an appropriate speaking order on the claim raised by the petitioner in the legal notice dated 10.01.2019 (Annexure P-4) within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

The writ petition stands disposed of.
