The petitioner seeks grant of concession of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.224 dated 6.4.2019 under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC registered at Police Station Model Town Rewari, District Rewari, Haryana.

Learned counsel appearing for the State has submitted that though the name of the petitioner does not find mention in the FIR, but during the investigation, it was revealed that the petitioner along with his brother Kuldeep and Vijender Yadav have obtained huge loan from M/s Shubham Housing Development Finance Company Ltd., on the basis of forged and fabricated documents and therefore, custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required so as to unearth the racket being run by the petitioner and his accomplices. It has further been pointed out that another case bearing FIR No.443 dated 6.6.2019 under Sections 420, 406, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC stands registered against the petitioner and his brothers Kuldeep and Vijender Yadav at Police Station Bahroad, District Alwar, Rajasthan. A

copy of the said FIR has been produced by the learned State counsel before the Court. A perusal thereof, would show that by adopting the similar modus operandi, the petitioner, his brothers and their accomplices are operating the racket of obtaining loans on the basis of forged and fabricated documents.

Taking into account that the role attributed to the petitioner is of serious nature coupled with the fact that the gang of the petitioner, his brothers and their accomplices, is operating in various States, the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required to unearth of aforesaid racket of cheating, duping and committing fraud with M/s Shubham Housing Development Finance Company Ltd.

In view of the above, I do not find any ground to grant concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Hence, the present petition is dismissed.
