Petitioner Dilbagh Singh has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.46 dated 28.03.2019, registered at Police Station Sadar Sangrur, District Sangrur, under Sections 420, 407, 465, 467, 468 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Prabhjot Singh Walia, Asstt. A.G, Punjab, has accepted notice on behalf of respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per the allegation in the FIR, the present petitioner forged documents of ownership of JCB machine, which he fraudulently sold to someone else. As per the FIR, which was got registered by Bhupinder Singh complainant, who purchased the said JCB machine from Angrej Singh and Dilbagh Singh was engaged as driver of the machine.

Learned State counsel has brought to the notice of this Court

that the documents especially the affidavit has been forged by the petitioner as Angrej Singh was original owner of the said JCB machine and stated that he never signed in Hindi and used to sign in English.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and the fact that the petitioner has forged the documents and has committed serious offence and he is named in the FIR and the active role has been played by him, he is required for custodial interrogation, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
