Having considered the submissions made by learned counsel for the parties and keeping in view the fact that the auction, which is being fixed by respondents No.2, 3 and 5, is only for sale of the shops in question, which does not affect the petitioners' occupation in the premises, for which separate proceedings have been initiated by respondent No.5 under the Public Premises Act, which matter is pending before the Sub Divisional Magistrate, Amritsar, this Court do not find any ground to interfere in the auction, which is being held by respondents No.2, 3 and 5 as these respondents are, admittedly, owners of the shops and an owner of the shop can sell his property at any time.

The writ petition, therefore, stands disposed of with above observation.
