GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioners have approached this Court seeking grant of anticipatory bail in respect of FIR No. 89, dated 20.4.2019, registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Bathinda, under Sections 323, 342, 498-A, 406, 506, 148 IPC.
2. At this stage Mr. Shilesh Gupta, Advocate has appeared on behalf of the complainant and filed power of attorney. The same is taken on record.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in fact the FIR came to be lodged due to some matrimonial discord and that the matter has now been amicably resolved and the parties have decided to part ways and in fact a petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, has already been filed wherein statements in the first motion have already been recorded.
4. The aforesaid position is not disputed by learned counsel for the complainant.
5. In view of the aforestated position, where the parties are stated to have amicably resolved their issues, the petition is accepted. In the event of arrest, the petitioner be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and cooperate with the Arresting/Investigating Officer and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
