ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.100, dated 21.04.2019, under Sections 457, 380 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Sardulgarh, District Mansa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that there is delay of 10 days in registering the FIR wherein it is alleged that a gas cylinder and gold ornaments weighing three tolas were stolen from the house of the complainant. He also contends that there is no prima facie evidence to connect the petitioner with the commission of the offence.

This Court, by the order dated 15.07.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Balraj Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 15.07.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
