AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

Learned counsel for the petitioner, while referring to para 4 of the reply dated 16.12.2017 which has been filed by the respondent No.2, submits that the said stand of the said respondent is acceptable to the petitioner and the writ petition may be disposed of in the said terms.

2. Para 4 of the reply dated 16.02.2017 of respondent No.2 reads as follows:-

“That in the light of the fact that the Petitioner/Applicant is entitled, under the existing rules to 50 hours overtime in any one quarter, and not more than 50 hours overtime in any one quarter, Respondent no. 2 with the aim to end the litigation, is ready and willing to analyze and review the service record of the Petitioner and make the payment towards overtime as put by the Petitioner, in accordance with his service record, showing the overtime hours put in by the Petitioner.”

3. Counsel for respondent No.2 states that the respondent would require some time to work out the actual overtime period, for which the petitioner has worked and on doing so, efforts will be made to release the payment due as worked out for the overtime he had spent, within a period of

4. The statement of the counsel for respondent No.2 is accepted and the writ petition is disposed of with directions to the respondents to work out the overtime, for which the petitioner has worked with the respondents and release the arrears within a period of two months from today.
