By way of the present petition, the petitioners have sought directions to the official respondents i.e. respondent Nos. 1 to 3 to take action against the private respondents for allegedly causing threat(s) to the life and liberty of the petitioners.

As per the contents of the petition, petitioner No.3- Gurpreet Kaur is married to respondent No.4-Kulwant Singh. The said marriage was performed against the wishes of petitioner No.3. Petitioner Nos. 1 and 2, being the family friends of the late parents of petitioner No.3, have now given her shelter and are helping her out to overcome the atrocities meted out at the hands of respondent Nos.4 and 5.

Though in the petition, it has been averred that petitioner No.3 has submitted a complaint to the Police at Delhi, yet no copy of such complaint has been annexed with the petition. Still further, it has been alleged that the petitioners had been given severe beatings by respondent Nos. 4 and 5 and their musclemen, yet no evidence, including the medical record or otherwise, has been placed on record.

From the said factual position, it can safely be concluded that the

instant petition has been filed with the bald allegations without there being any sound corroborative basis.

It is now well settled that the inherent jurisdiction under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is to be invoked in exceptional cases, wherein the circumstances lead to the conclusion that if the process is not issued, the same would entail a manifest injustice to the victim/petitioner therein. However, in the instant case, as stated above, nothing has been shown on record and/or pointed out, which may satisfy the conscience of this Court, to enter the process of inherent jurisdiction.

In view of the above, I do not find any merit in the present petition and the same is hereby dismissed.
