On 26.06.2019, following order was passed by this Court:-

“This is a petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.34 dated 14.03.2019 under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 & 120-B of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Jalandhar Cantt, District Jalandhar.

The FIR was registered on information received by the police that one Ravi S/o Raghbir in connivance with his companions Beeru, Guddu, Nilesh, Sudhir, Anjit Ankela and Lalla, all residents of Bihar had formed a gang in Jalandhar. They used to enter ATM booths when customers withdraw money and note down the ATM Card number and PIN codes and by preparing forged ATM cards, they used to withdraw all money from the accounts of innocent persons.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the

petitioner is in the whole sale business of fruits and vegetables. She has no connection with the said gang for their activity. Only allegation against her is that Ravi in his disclosure statement had stated that some amount had been deposited in account of the petitioner. No document has been annexed with the challan showing that any amount was deposited in account of the petitioner. The petitioner is having ill health and she has already undergone four surgeries.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, the petitioner-Amber Joshi shall be released on interim anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. The petitioner is also directed to join the investigation and cooperate with the Investigating Agency, as and when required. ”

Investigating Officer namely ASI Mewa Singh, who is present in the Court, has submitted that petitioner who is a female has joined investigation, cooperated and not required for further custodial interrogation.

Hence, order dated 26.06.2019 passed by this Court is made absolute.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed.
