The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in cross Rapat No.32 dated 13.05.2019 under Section 341, 323, 324, 148, 149 IPC and later on added offence under Section 326 IPC in case FIR No.8 dated 26.01.2019, under Sections 341, 323, 324, 148, 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Bhaini Mian Khan, District Gurdaspur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is a case of version and cross version. After the election for the post of Sarpanch, there was an altercation between the complainant party and the accused. Both the parties sustained injuries. Learned counsel states that the petitioner is alleged to have inflicted a dasti *dang* blow on left knee of Angrej Singh, which is simple in nature and that other co-accused have already been granted the concession of anticipatory bail. It is contended that in the FIR lodged by the petitioner, even the members of the complainant party are also on bail. He further contends that the matter has now been compromised and the petition for quashing the FIR is being filed.

A coordinate Bench of this Court, by the order dated 26.06.2019, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Amrik Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 26.06.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
