Present petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr. P.C.') for grant of bail pending trial to the petitioner, in FIR No.78 dated 16.04.2019, under Sections 379-B, 201, 411 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station City Sangrur, District Sangrur.

As per prosecution case, petitioner snatched the purse of the complainant when she reached near one shoe shop in Khalifa street, after withdrawing cash to the tune of ₹14,500/- from the Bank.

Contentends that the petitioner is in custody since 07.05.2019 and even the complainant while appearing as PW1 has not supported the prosecution version.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from police official present in Court, has fairly stated that complainant is not supporting the prosecution case and the petitioner is the first offender.

Heard both sides and perused the paper-book.

Since the petitioner is in custody since 07.05.2019, even the complainant is not supporting the prosecution version and keeping in view the fact that he is the first offender, this Court deems it appropriate to grant him bail pending trial.

In view of the above, this petition is allowed. Petitioner is ordered to be released on bail, in this case, on his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.

It is however, clarified that in case, there is any recurrence on the part of the petitioner, State of Punjab would be at liberty to move an application for recalling of this order.

The above observations may not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.

The petitioner shall fully co-operate with learned trial Court without seeking any unnecessary adjournments.
