Petitioner is stated to be a Class-1 Govt. Contractor. In the year 2015 the work of construction of CHC at Civil Surgeon Complex, Ludhiana, was allotted to the petitioner.

The short grievance raised in the petition is that inspite of the work having been executed and completed, an amount of Rs.43,71,342/- approximately has not been released.

Counsel argues that the action of the respondent authorities is arbitrary and the amount in question has been withheld without any justifiable basis.

Counsel makes a submission that a legal notice dated 14.1.2019 (Annexure P-2) has already been served and he would be satisfied, if, the writ petition was to be disposed of with a direction to the concerned authority to examine the same within a stipulated time frame.

Prayer made by counsel is found to be just and reasonable.

In view of the above and without even ascertaining the correctness of the averments made in the petition, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the same with a direction to respondent no.4 i.e. the Executive

Engineer (C), Punjab Health Systems Corporation, near Civil Hospital,

Phase-VI, Mohali to examine the claim of the petitioner against the backdrop of the legal notice dated 14.1.2019 (Annexure P-2) expeditiously and in any case within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

Needless to observe that if any amount is due to the petitioner, the same would be released without any further delay.

It is, however, clarified that this Court has not examined the claim of the petitioner on merits.

Disposed of.
