As per pleadings on record, petitioners were married with each other on 30.6.2019 against the wishes of the elders.

The instant petition has been filed seeking a mandamus directing the official respondents to take necessary measures to protect their life and liberty.

Learned counsel, at the very outset, apprises the Court that petitioner No.1 has been taken away by her parents to the parental home. He, as such, does not press the petition qua petitioner No.1. It is submitted that petitioner No.2 is a resident of the same village, he apprehends that upon going back, he would be harassed by the parents and close relatives of petitioner No.1 and some physical harm may also be caused.

Without even ascertaining the correctness of the averments made in the petition and without verifying the submissions advanced by the counsel, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the instant writ petition by granting liberty to petitioner

No.2 to approach respondent No.3 i.e. SHO, Police Station Sadar Jalalabad, District Fazilka as regards his apprehension and threat to life and liberty. In the eventuality of any such application being moved by petitioner No.2, respondent No.3 would be obligated to look into the matter and to thereafter take steps as he may deem fit and warranted in accordance with law.

Disposed of accordingly.
