HARI PAL VERMA, J.(Oral)

Petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for direction to respondent No.2 to look into the representation dated 31.05.2019 (Annexure P-1) and complaint dated 05.06.2019 (Annexure P-3).

Counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner states that in the aforesaid representation/complaint, the petitioner is being called by the police at odd hours and she has already appeared before the police authority as many as on 12 different occasions. The police is unnecessarily harassing the petitioner by calling her repeatedly.

Notice of motion only to respondents No.1 to 4 at this stage.

At the asking of the Court, Mr. Sukhbeer Singh, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of these respondents.

Let requisite number of copies of paper book be given to learned State counsel during the course of the day.

It is not in dispute that the petitioner has submitted complaint/ representation and in order to take necessary action thereon, the petitioner is certainly required to assist the police for proper appreciation of the representation/complaint. Therefore, the argument of the counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is being unnecessarily asked to come present, cannot be accepted.

However, considering the fact that the petitioner is a lady, and is allegedly being called by the police, without observing anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Amritsar (Rural) to look into the complaint dated 05.06.2019 (Annexure P-3) submitted by the petitioner and to act in accordance with law.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner, being a lady, be not called to the Police Station at odd hours and that too frequently.
