The present contempt petition has been filed pleading that there is wilful disobedience of the order dated 17.12.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No. 32279 of 2018. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“Without commenting upon the merits of the case or about the entitlement of the petitioners for the relief which has been claimed by them in the legal notice dated 2.11.2018 (Annexure P-11), the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to decide the legal notice dated 2.11.2018 (Annexure P-11) within a period of three months from the receipt of certified copy of this order.

In case, it is found that the petitioners are entitled to any monetary benefits after the decision of the legal notice, the same should also be paid to the petitioners within three

months thereafter.”

As per order dated 17.12.2018, the respondents had to decide the legal notice of the petitioners within a period of three months from the receipt of certified copy of the order.

Though the time period has already elapsed, at this stage still another opportunity is provided to the respondent to do the needful within three months from the receipt of certified copy of this order.

In case of failure, the petitioners would be at liberty to revive the contempt petition and the revival would be at the cost and responsibility of the respondents.

With the aforesaid observation, the contempt petition stands disposed of.
