The present contempt petition has been filed pleading that there is wilful disobedience of the order dated 26.3.2019 passed by this Court in CWP No. 7107 of 2019. The operative part of the order is reproduced below:

“In view of the above and without even going into the correctness of the averments made in the petition, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the same with a direction to respondent No. 2 to consider the claim of the petitioner against the backdrop of the legal notice dated 20.3.2018 (Annexure P-10) and to take a final decision thereupon expeditiously and in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

Disposed of.”

As per order dated 26.3.2019, the respondents had to take a decision on the legal notice within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order dated 26.3.2019.

Though the time period has already elapsed, at this stage still another opportunity is provided to the respondents to do the needful within four weeks from the receipt of certified copy of this order. In case of failure, the petitioner would be at liberty to revive the contempt petition and the revival would be at the cost and responsibility of the respondents. In case of imposition of cost, the same would be recovered personally from the defaulting official.

With the aforesaid observation, the contempt petition stands disposed of.
