Mr. K.K. Gupta, counsel for respondents no.1 to 3 submits that the payment of the CPF, GIS etc. cannot be processed as the petitioner no.1 was working with the Handling and Transport Contractor and was under Direct Payment System (DPS) from 01.01.1995. On account of the accident, the petitioner is not in a position to do his duties and on termination of work under the DPS system, only the admissible terminal dues would be paid to him.

Counsel for the petitioners submits that his legal notice (Annexure P/4) be treated as a request wherein he has specified that he is unable to do work.

Accordingly, the respondents shall take action on the said legal notice and dispense with the services as per the instructions. Thereafter,

they shall pay the amount due to him within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.

Counsel for the petitioners is not in a position to press the relief for compassionate appointment in view of the fact that the compassionate appointment policy could only be applicable in the case of death.

Accordingly, present petition is disposed of.
