Learned counsel for respondents No.4 and 5 states that in pursuance to the remand order passed by the Commissioner, neither the petitioner nor private respondent No.4 was found to be fit for appointment to the post of Lambardar by the Collector, Patiala.

Fresh process was initiated for appointment to the post of Lambardar, in which one Manjit Singh son of Teja Singh stands appointed as Lambardar on 25.07.2014.

This aspect was never brought to the notice of the Court.

In view of the above and in the light of the statement made by counsel for respondents No.4 and 5, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
