Petitioner Rani has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.22 dated 26.03.2019, registered at Police Station Sadar, District Gurdaspur, under Sections 22 and 29 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

In the present case, the recovery from the present petitioner is 100 grams of heroin which admittedly falls under non-commercial.

As per learned State counsel, two more cases are pending against the petitioner. One is for possessing 1½ grams of heroin and another case under the Punjab Excise Act.

The petitioner has been in custody since 26.03.2019. She is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial

custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping her in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to her furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
