The present contempt petition has been filed pleading that there is wilful disobedience of the order dated 14.2.2019 passed by this Court in CWP No. 4010 of 2019. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“Without going into the merits of the case or expressing any opinion to the entitlement of the petitioner in respect of the claim prayed in the present writ petition or in the legal notice, the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 4 to pass an appropriate speaking order on the claim raised by the petitioner in the legal notice dated 31.12.2018 (Annexure P-1) within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

In case after the order, it is found by the respondents that the petitioner is entitled for any monetary benefits, the

same should also be released to her within a period of next three months.

The writ petition stands disposed of.”

As per order dated 14.2.2019, the respondent had to pass a speaking order within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order on the claim raised by the petitioner in the legal notice .

Though the time period has already elapsed, at this stage still another opportunity is provided to the respondents to do the needful within six weeks from the receipt of certified copy of this order.

In case of failure, the petitioner would be at liberty to revive the contempt petition and the revival would be at the cost and responsibility of the respondent.

With the aforesaid observation, the contempt petition stands disposed of.
