RAJ MOHAN SINGH, J. (ORAL)

An application for de-exhibiting the documents got exhibited by the defendant in his evidence has been dismissed by the trial Court by observing that mere exhibition of document does not dispense with proof of execution.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the defendant has not relied upon the documents in question in the written statement as per requirement under Order 8 Rule 1-A CPC.

Even this aspect of the matter is subject to judicial scrutiny by the trial Court at the relevant stage.

If the execution of document is found to be on legal parameters, the document can be relied by the Court. In case,

execution is found to be otherwise, the Court would be at liberty to eschew the same in accordance with law.

There is no procedure for de-exhibiting the document in the Code.

In view of above legal position, no indulgence can be granted in favour of the petitioner.

This revision petition is accordingly, dismissed.
