AVNEESH JHINGAN, J. (Oral)

The present contempt petition is filed alleging wilful disobedience of the order dated 25.3.2019 passed by this court in CWP No. 5854 of 2017. The operative part of the order is reproduced below:

“Counsel for the respondents-State states that case of the petitioner will be considered in view of the letter dated 14.8.2018 issued by the respondents and an appropriate order will be passed in this regard within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Keeping in view the statement given on behalf of the respondents-State, recorded above, counsel for the petitioner states that no further orders are required to be passed in the present writ petition and the same be disposed of as not pressed.

Disposed of, as not pressed.”

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Ritu Rani (LA), Department of Secondary Education (Aided Branch), Haryana, submits that the matter has been sent to the Finance Department and needful will be done within six weeks from today.

In view of the statement made, the contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous. However, the petitioner would be at liberty to revive the same if the statement made today in court is not adhered to.

In case petitioner is forced to revive the contempt petition, costs may be imposed which shall be recovered from the defaulting official.
