Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for short 'Cr. P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail to petitioner, in FIR No.76 dated 07.05.2019, under Sections 324, 506, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short 'IPC') (Sections 341, 325, 326 of IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Shahkot, District Jalandhar Rural.

Mr. Sandeep Arora, Advocate appears, files his *vakalatnama* on behalf of the complainant and the same is taken on record.

On 08.07.2019, while issuing notice of motion, this Court has passed the following order:-

“Contends that not only there is delay of 07 days in registration of the FIR, rather the petitioner's side also suffered injuries and reference is made to MLRs (P-7 to P-

10).

Notice of motion for 16.10.2019.

In the meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation before the Investigating Officer. In the event of his arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit him to interim bail in the present case till the next date of hearing on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his satisfaction. The petitioner is also directed to abide by all the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Manjinder Singh, has stated that in terms of order dated 08.07.2019, the petitioner has joined investigation and his custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of the above, order dated 08.07.2019 granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.

Petition stands disposed off, accordingly.

However, it is made clear that the petitioner shall fully co-operate with the Investigating Officer as and when called for further investigation.

The above observations may not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
