The present contempt petition has been filed alleging wilful disobedience of the order dated 31.5.2019 passed by this Court in CWP No. 15777 of 2019. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“The petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 3 i.e. SHO Police Station Longowal, District Sangrur that in case any representation is filed seeking protection of life and liberty, the contents thereof be duly verified and if necessary, requisite steps be taken strictly in accordance with law for grant of protection of life and liberty to the petitioners. It is clarified that this order shall not be treated as a stamp of this court for marriage of the parties.”

Reply by way of affidavit of Sandeep Kumar Garg, IPS, Senior Superintendent of Police, District Sangrur filed in court is taken on record.

Copy thereof has been given to learned counsel for the petitioners.

Learned counsel for the State submits that the petitioners had made statements before the police on 10.6.2019 and in view of the statements, no protection was provided.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that in view of the reply filed, no cause of action survives for contempt. However, he seeks liberty that in future, if need so arises, the petitioners would move an application for protection.

Dismissed as infructuous with liberty as prayed for.
