ARUN MONGA, J.(ORAL)

Learned counsel for respondents No.2 to 5, at the outset submits that during pendency of the writ petition, an order dated 06.05.2019 has been passed by Secretary, Punjab Mandi Board. Copy whereof has been handed over in Court, which is taken on record. Copy of the same has also been supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner.

2. Learned counsel further submits that pursuant to the said order, the termination of the petitioner has been revoked and, therefore, the impugned order dated 14.08.2013 (Annexure P-7), terminating his services has been rendered ineffective. He further submits that present writ petition is, therefore, rendered infructuous and is liable to be dismissed as such.

3. Per contra, learned counsel for the petitioner points out that the consequential benefits arising out of the revocation of the termination of the petitioner have not been decided vide order dated 06.05.2019 and still survive consideration.

4. In the premise, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.4 to determine the entitlement of the consequential benefits of the petitioner and pass a speaking order in accordance with law.

5. In case the petitioner is entitled to any consequential pecuniary benefits, the same be disbursed to him along with interest @ 6 % per annum.

6. Let the needful be done within a period of 3 months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

7. Petition is disposed of with above terms.
