This petition has been filed under the provisions of Section 439 Cr.P.C., for grant of 'regular bail' to the petitioner in case FIR No.0018, dated 27.06.2018, registered at Police Station Kacha Pacca, District Tarn Taran, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Section 22 of the NDPS Act, 1985.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that admittedly only 19 strips of tablets were shown to be recovered from the petitioner (as per the Investigating Agency), with no batch number or manufacturing date given on those strips, with only 10 tablets sent for forensic examination, in which the salt *Alprazolam* was found to the extent of 1.46 grams, and though otherwise the total quantity would come to 166 grams, yet only 10 tablets having been sent for analysis, the total weight cannot be taken into consideration. She further submits that the petitioner has been in custody for the past 08 months and trial is not likely to conclude in near future.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Dalbir Singh, submits that out of total 08 prosecution witnesses, only 01 has been examined so

far and on specific query, he submits on instructions that there is no other criminal case registered against him.

That being so, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner shall be admitted to bail upon his furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
