AMOL RATTAN SINGH J.(Oral)

Pursuant to the order dated 30.08.2019, a photocopy of a communication shown to be addressed by the Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Zira, to the Registrar General of this Court, dated 04.12.2019, is on record, stating therein that the complainant (i.e. respondent No.2 Balwinder Singh) and Kamaljit Singh (stated by the learned counsel for the petitioner to be also an affected party), having recorded their joint statement to the effect that they have compromised the matter with all the accused of their own free will and that they have no objection to the FIR in question being quashed against all the accused.

As per the assessment of that Court, the compromise has actually been arrived at between the parties voluntarily and of their free

will.

Upon a specific query to learned counsel for the petitioners, he submits that there is no other person who is affected on account of what is stated to be an offence made out in the FIR, which is also corroborated by learned State counsel, on instructions from the police official present to assist him.

That being so, even though what is on the case file is a photocopy of the said communication, but the said photocopy having been placed on record by the Registry of this Court, it is accepted, subject to all just exceptions.

In view of the above, with learned State counsel also having taken instructions that there is no other criminal case shown to be registered against the petitioners, the petition is allowed and FIR No. 116, dated 24.7.2013, registered against the petitioners at Police Station Makhu, District Ferozepur, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC, along with all proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
