The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of the order dated 04.10.2017 passed in CWP No. 17667 of 2011.

The operational part of the order is reproduced below:-

“ In view of the submission made by learned counsel for the applicant-petitioners, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the petitioners to file fresh representations and in case such representations are filed within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order, the respondents are directed to pass a speaking order within a period of two months thereafter in view of ratio of judgment rendered in CWP No.21251 of 2014 titled as Nasib Singh & others Vs. State of Punjab and others decided on 08.02.2017. In case the petitioners are not found to be entitled for the relief claimed, then a detailed speaking order be passed.”

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Aditya Sharda, AAG, Punjab accepts

notice. Requisite copies of the paper book have been supplied to learned State counsel.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Mr. Jagdeep Singh, SDE, Department of Water Supply and Sanitation, Punjab, who is present in Court in some other matter submits that the needful if not already done, would be done within six weeks from today.

In view of statement made, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that no cause of action survives for pursuing the present petition.

Disposed of as infructuous.

Needless to add that petitioners would be at liberty to revive the present petition in case the afore-said statement is not adhered to.
