Mr. Bali, learned counsel for the petitioner, today submits that even the grandmother of the petitioner, i.e. the mother of her uncle who has allegedly turned her out of the flat in question, (as also naturally the mother of the petitioners' father), has also sworn an affidavit (Annexure P-10), to the effect that the petitioner was living in the said flat, i.e. Flat no.701, Block A, Tower Primrose, 7th Floor, Sector-70, Mohali, which she was not allowed to enter, having been stopped by the petitioners' uncle, Sunil Vij, his wife and son.

He further points to the agreement/settlement reached between the petitioners' father and her uncle as regards the aforesaid flat, to the extent that the petitioners' father would have a half share in it.

Though otherwise the matter may have been entirely civil in nature, with regard to non-honouring of a settlement, the contention is that the petitioner having been thrown out of her home at night, where she was

living, as a young girl, her life was put to danger.

Without making any comment on the aforesaid contention, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police, SAS Nagar, Mohali (respondent no.2), to hear the petitioner and thereafter to take action as may be required as per law, within a period of 15 days from today.
