Learned counsel for the petitioner states that after the impugned order dated 03.11.2015 (Annexure P-5) was passed, the respondents had amended the eligibility condition for the grant of 23 years promotional increment vide Resolutions dated 21.08.2018 and 01.10.2018. Learned counsel states that in view of the Resolutions stated above, the petitioner is fully eligible under the amended condition of eligibility for the grant of promotional increment after 23 years of service. Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the Coordinate Bench has disposed of a bunch of writ petitions bearing CWP No. 1013 of 2017, on 29.11.2018 vide which directions have been issued to the respondent-Corporation to consider the claim of the employees in view of the Resolutions which the Corporation

have passed on 21.08.2018 as well as on 01.10.2018. Learned counsel for the petitioner further states that the present writ petition be also disposed of in terms of the order passed by this Court in CWP No. 1013 of 2017 on 29.11.2018.

Learned counsel for the respondents very fairly states that though the case of the petitioner was rejected on 03.11.2015 (Annexure P-5) but the same was done prior to passing of the the Resolutions on 21.08.2018 and 01.10.2018 passed by the Corporation and as the eligibility conditions for the grant of 23 years promotional increment have already been amended, the case of the petitioner will be considered afresh in view of the subsequent event after the passing of the impugned order by ignoring the rejection order dated 03.11.2015 (Annexure P-5).

Learned counsel for the parties are also agreed that the present writ petition can be disposed of in terms of the order passed by this Court in CWP No. 1013 of 2017 on 29.11.2018.

In view of the above, the present writ petition is also disposed of in terms of the order passed by this Court in CWP No. 1013 of 2017, on 29.11.2018.

It is made clear that the respondents shall ignore the earlier rejection of the case of the petitioner.
