Heard. For the reasons stated in the application, the same is
allowed and Annexures P-5 to P-7 are taken on record.

CRM-M-30464 of 2019

The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.86 dated
24.03.2019 under Sections 323, 307, 34 of IPC registered at Police Station
Pinjore, District Panchkula.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is alleged in the
FIR that the petitioner has caused an injury with a knife on the back of the
complainant which was found to be grievous in nature but there is no medical
opinion that the injury was dangerous to life. The FIR is an outcome of a
matrimonial dispute between the son of the petitioner and the complainant
which has now been resolved. He has referred to the copy of the affidavit filed
by the complainant in this regard which is at Annexure P-3. He also contends

that the petitioner is over 60 years of age and is in custody for almost four months since his arrest on 26.03.2019. He also states that the complainant has fully recovered from the injury.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from Head Constable Santosh Kumar, states that although the charges have been framed but no prosecution witness has been examined.

Heard.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner especially when the petitioner is over 60 years of age and is in custody for almost four months and conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
