AVNEESH JHINGAN, J. (Oral)

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading that there is wilful disobedience of the order dated 27.3.2019 passed by this Court in CWP No. 8023 of 2019. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“Without commenting upon the merits of the case or about the entitlement of the petitioners for the relief which has been claimed by them in the legal notice dated 24.11.2018 (Annexure P-2), the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to decide the legal notice dated 24.11.2018 (Annexure P-2) within a period of three months from the receipt of copy of this order.

In case, it is found that the petitioner is entitled to any monetary benefits after the decision of the legal notice, the same should also be paid to the petitioner within three months

thereafter.”

As per order dated 27.3.2019, the respondents had to take a decision on the legal notice of the petitioner within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order.

As per the averments made in the petition, copy of the order passed by this Court was sent to the respondents on 3.4.2019 but there is no proof for the same. Let atleast now copy be supplied to the respondents and in case of doing the needful, the respondents shall ensure compliance of the order dated 27.3.2019 within three months from the receipt of certified copy of this order. In case of non-compliance, costs may be imposed which shall be recoverable from the defaulting official.

With the aforesaid observation, the contempt petition stands disposed of.
