The present contempt petition has been filed alleging wilful disobedience of the order dated 28.5.2018 passed by this Court in CWP No. 13653 of 2018. The operative part of the said order is reproduced below:

“After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner, perusing the present petition and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the controversy, we dispose of the present petition by granting liberty to the petitioner to file a detailed and comprehensive representation raising all the pleas as raised in the present writ petition, before competent authority. It is, however, clarified that in case such a representation is filed, the same shall be decided by the respondent authority within a period of two months, after affording an opportunity of hearing to the petitioner and by passing a speaking order, in accordance with law.”

Status report dated 18.9.2019 by way of affidavit of Mr. Virbhan Singh Tanwar, IFS, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden, Haryana annexing order dated 13.9.2019 filed in Court is taken on record, copy handed over to learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that in view of the reply filed, no cause of action survives for pursuing the present contempt petition, however, he seeks liberty to avail remedies available in accordance with law against the order dated 13.9.2019.

Disposed of as infructuous with liberty as prayed for.
