RAJAN GUPTA, J.(ORAL)

This order will dispose of aforesaid bunch of writ
petitions. For brevity, the facts are extracted from CWP
No.15588 of 2018.

Petitioners have challenged the selection list of short-listed candidates for the examination of ADA on the basis of defective revised answer keys. During the course of hearing of the petitions, various directions were given by the Coordinate Benches. Accordingly, Punjab Public Service Commission took steps after notifying the list, invited objections as well as cross-objections.

Today, it has been stated that after the final selection list was published, the process of interview was carried out from 6th to 19th March, 2019. Final result on the basis of report of the Expert Committee has been prepared and is available in a sealed cover.

This Court does not intend to open the sealed cover. It cannot be certainty whether in the selection process, petitioners may have succeeded or not.

The prayer of Punjab Public Service Commission is that it may be allowed to publish the result so that process is not delayed any further. This Court finds the prayer reasonable.

The petitions are, thus, disposed of with the liberty to Punjab Public Service Commission to publish the result. Needless to observe that petitioners would be at liberty to avail their remedies, in case any grouse subsists against the final selection.
