Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.09 dated 30.01.2019, under Sections 379-B, 342, 506 and 120-B of the IPC, registered at Police Station Tappa Mandi, District Barnala.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR has been got registered by Kuldeep Singh. In the FIR, it is stated that one Sukhwinder Singh had

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joined the business of complainant. Later on, he called him (complainant) to his house where 10 more persons entered in his house and snatched his mobile phone. It is also stated in the FIR that they also confined him for about three hours and mentally tortured him and even uttered bad words and prepared the video. The petitioner and two other persons stated themselves to be the head of Crime Branch of all India.

Challan has already been presented. The petitioner has been in custody since 03.04.2019. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of case may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
