TEJINDER SINGH DHINDSA, J.

The instant writ petition was filed seeking a mandamus for directing the respondents to release the compensation to the petitioner being an acid attack survivor.

On the previous date of hearing, i.e. 6.12.2018, the following order was passed by this Court:

"Mr.Ajaivir Singh, Advocate representing respondent Nos.2 and 3 has informed the Court that a sum of Rs.5 lakhs has been disbursed to the petitioner in pursuance to the award passed by the Victim Compensation Committee, Moga. Furthermore, a payment of Rs.10,10,973.73/- has

been disbursed in pursuance to proceedings dated 21.12.2017 of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board, Moga. Counsel submits that in view of such payments having been released, the claim of the petitioner stands satisfied.

Hearing is deferred on account of non-appearance of counsel representing the petitioner.

List on 4.2.2019.”

Apparently, compensation amounts having already been disbursed to the petitioner and as noticed in the order dated 6.12.2018 explains non-appearance of counsel for the petitioner today as also on 6.12.2018.

Writ petition is disposed of as infructuous.

Liberty, however, is granted to the petitioner to seek revival of the writ petition by filing the requisite application and upon demonstrating that any cause of action still survives.
